This week's topic is THE CENSUS

Historical context:

The 2014 census will the first census to be held in the country in over 30 years. The most complete historical census, albeit one that left large areas unsurveyed, was in the colonial era in 1931. In the past censuses of 1973 and 1983, the country's ongoing armed conflicts put many parts of the country out of reach, as large areas of territory were under insurgent control. The results of the most recent censuses are still contested and Myanmar's published population figures range from 48 million to 65 million. Many ethnic civil society groups have called upon the government to delay or amend the 2014 census on the grounds its methodology is flawed on the question of ethnicity and could be used to strip minorities of their rights. International groups have warned that the questions and timing of the 2014 Census could trigger further violence against minority Muslims, and undermine the government's reform process and peace negotiations with armed ethnic groups.

Facts & figures:

- The government expects to have 26,000 supervisors and 85,000 enumerators trained by the end of March. Most are local teachers.
- The cost of the exercise is estimated at over \$74 million US dollars.
- There are 41 questions in the census.
- The Myanmar Census 2014 is a nation-wide census scheduled to take place between 30 March and 10 April 2014 in Burma
- The last census to be conducted in Myanmar was in 1983.

"For the census, there is no count on whether people are legal or illegal residences. The census is just a survey on how many people live in the country".
